



Since 1956, thousands of caring donors have invested in the community they love through gifts to the Licking County Foundation. In 2012-2013, 866 gifts totaling \$2.9 million were received from individuals, families, businesses, other foundations and organizations—which included the establishment of 20 new charitable funds! At the end of 2013, the Foundation's assetsthe community's endowment-had grown to \$68.2 million.

The Foundation also received some unusual gifts—a fountain, a fitness zone, and a historic building. These special gifts will continue to have a positive impact on our community for years to come.

### **FOUNTAIN FOR FOUNDATION PARK**

In the fall of 2013, a friend of the Foundation provided funds to install a striking new fountain in Foundation Park, located in front of our building in downtown Newark. We are tremendously grateful for this delightful gift. With water cascading from stately basalt columns, the fountain's tranquil beauty is enjoyed daily by the many who find respite in this lovely urban oasis.

### **FITNESS FOR ALL ON THE NEWARK CAMPUS**

In late 2013, a partnership between the Patricia R. and Herbert J. Murphy Foundation (generous funding), the City of Newark (construction oversight and ongoing maintenance) and the Licking County Foundation (contract coordination and financial management) resulted in the installation of an Outdoor Fitness Zone on the Newark Campus. The new site provides a unique way to promote wellness with exercise equipment that is fun, affordable and accessible for almost everyone, including people with mobility impairments.

### **SHAPING THE NEXT 100 YEARS** FOR A COMMUNITY TREASURE

Located on Courthouse Square in downtown Newark, the Home Building Association Bank building commonly known as "The Old Home" was designed by noted American architect Louis Sullivan, who is often credited as being the father of the modern skyscraper. He was Frank Lloyd Wright's mentor and coined the famous phrase, "form follows function." Toward the end of his career, Sullivan built eight banks, which are now considered "jewel boxes" and are among the most treasured architectural gems in the United States. Stephen Jones, a Newark native working in commercial real estate finance in New York, donated The Old Home to the Licking County Foundation in December 2013. Next year will mark the 100th anniversary of this building's opening, and we are excited about the opportunity to



shape how it will continue to figure in the history and heritage of this area.

We are grateful to the donors of these uncommon gifts. Because of their generosity, all of us have the opportunity to reflect in a tranquil urban park, get fit in an accessible outdoor gym, and continue to be inspired by the creation of an architectural master.

We are grateful for the difference that philanthropy is making in the lives of our neighbors and the investment our donors are making in the future of Licking County. Our donors believe that having strong nonprofit organizations and sustaining the services they provide is integral to this community's vitality-422 grants totaling \$2.3 million were awarded in 2012-2013. The Foundation's grants help area nonprofits meet the ever-changing needs of our community and respond to new programs, emerging needs and innovative services. Our donors also believe in the power of higher education and that the future of our area depends upon a well-educated and skilled workforce—543 scholarships totaling \$1.3 million were also awarded in the same time period. These scholarships supported students of all ages (high school seniors, current college students, and adult re-entry students) who attended a wide range of post-secondary institutions (two-year colleges, four-year universities, and licensed trade/vocational schools) across the country.

We hope that you enjoy reading this annual report and are inspired by how people are helping change the lives of many in Licking County! On behalf of the Foundation's board, staff and volunteers, we thank you for supporting this community in your own special way and helping to make it such an extraordinary place in which to live, work and play.

### 2012 FIBERGLAS FEDERAL CREDIT UNION SCHOLARSHIP FUND

A designated agency fund established through a bequest from Jerry and Selma Markowitz to support the nonprofit organizations that they cared about most for many generations to come: Mental Health America of Licking County, A Special Wish Foundation of Licking County, New Beginnings, A Call To College, Camp O'Bannon, Big Brothers Big Sisters, and Par Excellence Academy.



### NEWARK CITY SCHOOLS 8TH GRADE WASHINGTON DC TRIP FUND

A project fund established by Newark City Schools to hold contributions that are being raised to provide scholarships to help offset the cost of the annual Washington DC trip for Newark City Schools' 8th grade students who have financial need.

### HOWARD H. THOMPSON, JR. FUND

An unrestricted fund established through a bequest from Howard H. Thompson, Jr. to address the community's most urgent needs and emerging opportunities. 92 years-old when he died in 2010, Mr. Thompson was a Newark resident, served in World War II, attended Muskingum College, was an avid reader, and cared about education.

### UTICA GOING ONWARD SCHOLARSHIP FUND

A scholarship fund established by siblings who are long-time Utica residents to support post-secondary education for graduates of Utica High School (including high school seniors, current college students, and non-traditional students who are 35 years of age or younger) with a cumulative 1.75 to 2.99 GPA and who demonstrate financial need.

### FRED B. WOLLINS MEMORIAL FUND

A field of interest fund established in memory of Fred B. Wollins by his family and friends to support projects or programs that improve, promote or beautify downtown Newark, Ohio. As owner of H. L. Art Jewelers, Inc. for 35 years and a passionate civic leader, it was important to Mr. Wollins that downtown Newark remains vibrant and continues to grow.



### 2013 CENTENARY UNITED METHODIST CHURCH LEGACY ENDOWMENT FUND

An agency fund established by the Church Council of the Centenary United Methodist Church to provide an ongoing source of income for operations and programs. Centenary's Vision is: We will be a church bursting with music, song, praise and laughter.

Through prayer, we will be connected with God's presence and with each other. In a close-knit community, we will share our lives and concerns. In love, our congregation will invite, serve, and welcome those who are in need of God's love and Christ's saving grace.

### CHAMBERLAIN - POWERS MEMORIAL MATHEMATICS SCHOLARSHIP FUND

A scholarship fund established by Carole Ann Chamberlain who taught mathematics at Newark High School (NHS) for 36 years of a 42-year teaching career, retiring in 2008. This scholarship was also created in memory of Wilbur Powers who was the one-time chair of the Mathematics Department at NHS until 1982. Mr. Powers taught at NHS for 24 years of a 35-year teaching career. Mrs. Chamberlain and Mr. Powers were outstanding teachers, totally devoted to mathematics learning, and demanding the best of their students. The scholarship assists Newark High School graduating seniors who demonstrate outstanding achievement in Advanced Placement Calculus and want to further their studies at an accredited two-year or four-year college or university. The recipient selection will be made by the AP Calculus teacher at NHS.



### **COURTHOUSE SQUARE FOUNTAIN FUND**

A project fund established by The City of Newark for the purpose of raising funds to install a new fountain on Courthouse Square in downtown Newark.

### PAM DEVAUL GIVING BACK FUND

A designated agency fund established through the estate of Pamela Marie DeVaul to assist the Village of Hebron for the purpose of constructing and maintaining a "Welcome to Hebron" entrance sign; and the Lakewood Local School District for the purpose of supporting a program that involves community volunteers with tutoring struggling elementary school students (K to 5) in reading. The grant can be used to provide reading materials, relevant computer software, and training for teachers and/or tutors. Pam, who passed away in August 2013, was retired from the State of Ohio Department of Agriculture, and was a member of Hebron Village Council. She was very active with the Lakewood school board and in the Hebron community. She organized the OhioReads program at Lakewood schools and through it touched many children's lives.



### DENNIS FREY AND MELODY BASCOM FREY STUDENT TRAVEL GRANT FUND

A field of interest fund established by Dennis Frey and Melody Bascom Frey for providing financial support to individual students or a student group from Newark High School or Watkins Memorial High School for international travel. Dennis and Melody Frey are passionate about traveling. Dennis grew up in Newark and attended Newark High School. Melody grew up in the Kirkersville area and graduated from Watkins Memorial High School. Both worked in Licking County, Dennis with the Newark Police Department and Melody as a teacher for Southwest Licking Schools at Kirkersville Elementary. After retirement, Dennis and Melody increased their overseas travels. The Freys want students to have the opportunity to expand their understanding of the world, develop appreciation for diversity, and build memories through travel.

### SERGEANT DENNIS FREY AND K-9 BERNIE FREY Police Equipment grant fund

A field of interest fund established by Dennis Frey to provide grants to any Licking County Law Enforcement Agency to acquire dogs for K-9 units, finance specialized training, or to purchase equipment that will enrich the police agency and help serve the community. The Frey brothers were active in numerous civic organizations and the Newark Police Department. Bernard started the K-9 unit. Dennis assisted this unit in the early years, while Bernie continued to help with dog demonstrations and events even after his retirement. Dennis participated in the Honor Guard and was Head of the Technical Accident Investigation Unit, chairman of the Building Committee, and Head of the Police Reserve Unit. Both received special recognition for their achievements, and both felt it a civic responsibility to give back to the community.

### **HEATH EDUCATION FOUNDATION FUND**

A donor advised fund established by the Heath Education Foundation Board for the purpose of providing ongoing financial support for the benefit of the students and educators of Heath City Schools in furtherance of educational efforts in specific areas such as teacher and principal grants, recognition of educational excellence, and other special projects.

### HEATH EDUCATION FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP FUND



The Heath Education Foundation is dedicated to furthering educational excellence in Heath City Schools and helping students achieve their goals of pursuing post-secondary education.

### LICKING PARK DISTRICT BOYD WILKINS RESERVE FUND

An agency fund established by the Licking Park District Board of Commisioners for the purposes of maintenance, improvement and educational programs for the Licking Park District's Boyd Wilkins Reserve property (located at 1170 Wilkins Road NE in Newark, Ohio) which is a 168-acre farm donated in 2007 by Donald and Margaret Boyd.

### CHARLENE LITTERINI MEMORIAL Scholarship fund

A scholarship fund established by Don Litterini in memory of his wife Charlene Litterini, who spent 30 years as a teacher in the Johnstown-Monroe School District. During her career, Mrs. Litterini started teaching elementary students then continued teaching Social Studies and Remedial Reading in the Adams Middle School. After retiring, she continued helping children as a private tutor. A long-time resident of Johnstown, Charlene Litterini was born in

Gallipolis, Ohio and passed away in February 2013. Married for 51 years, the Litterinis have two children, daughter Teri Hiter and son Shawn Litterini, and a grandson, Giovanni Litterini. This scholarship assists graduates of Johnstown-Monroe High School who plan to further their studies at an accredited college, university, vocational/ technical school or other post-secondary institutions.

### VAN AND MILDRED ROSS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

A scholarship fund established by the Last Will and Testament of Mildred Ruth Ross who passed away in September 2012 at 93 years of age. Along with her husband, Van Arthur Ross, she was a long-time resident of Croton, Ohio. Mr. Ross was a real estate agent who passed away in December 2007 at 88 years of age. Both Mr. and Mrs. Ross were active in the Sunbury Chapters of the Masons and the Eastern Star. They also enjoyed camping and spending winters in Florida. The scholarship assists Northridge High School graduating seniors who plan to further their studies at an accredited college, university, vocational/technical school or other postsecondary institutions.

### DANIEL AND SHARON STRICKER FUND

A field of interest fund established by Daniel Stricker to support the recreational and educational activities for youth with preference given to economically disadvantaged children. This fund is also created in memory of Sharon Stricker who passed away in 2000. She taught at Hazelwood, Hartzler, Central and Cherry Valley schools in Newark. Dan is a retired dentist.

### **DAWES ARBORETUM**

\$15,000 to support a new community service with increased education opportunities in a Learning and Enabling Garden which will be accessible to school groups, community organizations, and the general public—including people of varying abilities. Granted in 2013.

### FOUNDATION FOR HOSPICE OF CENTRAL OHIO

\$3,000 to support the children's bereavement program which includes a week-long day camp for children (ages of 6 to 12) who have experienced the death of a parent, sibling, grandparent, friend or other special person in their lives; and educational/support groups offered in area schools. Granted in 2012.

### FOUNDATION FOR HOSPICE OF CENTRAL OHIO

\$25,000 to support upgrading the Selma Markowitz Care Center inpatient care center including changes in lighting, flooring, cabinetry, work stations, nurse call stations and the whirlpool area as well as the addition of a family counseling room. Granted in 2012 (\$12,500) & 2013 (\$12,500).

### **GRANVILLE STUDIO OF VISUAL ARTS**

\$5,100 to purchase art materials and supplies for the Teen Journey art education classes for at-risk Newark teens from the YES Club. Granted in 2012.

### **GRANVILLE STUDIO OF VISUAL ARTS**

\$4,500 to support a mural workshop for YES Club students to explore the history and techniques of mural-making and create a public mural on the exterior of the YES Clubhouse. Granted in 2013.

### CHILD ADVOCACY CENTER OF LICKING COUNTY

\$7,215 to support the child and family Victim Advocate position to provide protection and assistance to all victims; assist victims in obtaining mental health care; and give children and their families the resources to heal from abuse. Granted in 2013.

### CHILDREN'S READING FOUNDATION OF LICKING COUNTY

\$5,000 to support the "Reach Out and Read" program which provides brand new books to children (ages 6 months to 5 years) at their pediatric well-child checkups where pediatricians and pediatric nurse practitioners encourage families to read together for 20 minutes every day to increase child literacy. Granted in 2012.

"Several parents at LMH Pediatrics have informed providers that the books from Reach Out and Read are the only children's books available in the household. Most of the older children are now expecting and asking for their books at their checkups. I have had parents tell me that the children are so pleased at receiving a book at their checkup that they will carry it with them everywhere they go." – William Knobeloch, MD

BEHAVIORAL HEALTHCARE PARTNERS OF CENTRAL OHIO, INC

\$7,500 to support the installation of an ADA-compliant bathroom at the Altmaier House facility which provides safe, clean and stable housing for those in our community who are homeless due to severe and persistent mental health issues. Granted in 2012.

### BEHAVIORAL HEALTHCARE PARTNERS OF CENTRAL OHIO, INC.

\$13,000 to support the installation of a fire sprinkler system at the Altmaier House facility. Granted in 2013.

### BEHAVIORAL HEALTHCARE PARTNERS OF CENTRAL OHIO, INC.

\$7,500 to support the replacement of the main bathroom at Spencer House Men's Recovery Center, a 20-bed, 6-month residential facility for those struggling with alcohol and/or other drug dependency. Granted in 2013.

### **BETH MESSIAH CONGREGATION**

\$4,000 to support youth programs at Beth Messiah Congregation. Granted in 2012 (\$2,000) & 2013 (\$2,000).

### LEADS/BUCKEYE LAKE HEAD START CENTER

\$5,000 to support the enhancement and expansion of the existing outdoor play space at the Buckeye Lake LEADS facility. Granted in 2012.

### LICKING COUNTY AGING PROGRAM

\$4,895 to support the Hearing Fund which helps low income senior citizens from Licking County obtain hearing enhancement equipment, repairs and replacements. Granted in 2013.

"The Hearing Fund has been able to provide hearing aids for those who could not afford to purchase them on their own. The cost of this equipment to those living in poverty is so overwhelming that they will, with no other choice or assistance, go without. This service has restored recipients' ability to once again hear spoken words clearly and increased their ability to perform basic life needs, such as operating a telephone, that help reduce the feeling of isolation."

### LICKING COUNTY CENTER FOR THE VISUALLY IMPAIRED

\$30,000 to support replenishing the supply of low vision aids (such as magnifying glasses; talking clocks and watches; large print calendars and address books; big button telephones, calculators and television remotes; easy-to-read thermometers and blood pressure kits; and closed circuit televisions); and to provide eye care for low income Licking County residents who are 59 years old and younger. Granted in 2012.

"The LCCVI non-senior project helped nearly 300 people in the Licking County area that would not otherwise have been able to receive eye care services. The significant factor is the heightened dignity and peace of mind they feel when they are getting the same professional eye care services as other county residents who can afford it. They leave their appointments most often with a solution and always with information presented to them in terms they can understand. They are shown respect."

### LICKING COUNTY CENTER FOR THE VISUALLY IMPAIRED

\$40,000 to support eye care services to clients with financial need who are 59 years old and younger. Services include professional assessments counseling, eye examinations, and glasses by local optometrists and ophthalmologists. Granted in 2013.

### LICKING COUNTY COALITION For Housing

\$8,500 to support the purchase of a box truck for the Transitional Housing and developmental disability property management programs to pick up donated goods; assist clients as they move into permanent housing; acquire low-cost auction items; and perform



routine property maintenance. Granted in 2012.

### LICKING COUNTY COALITION FOR HOUSING

\$4,760 to support a safe place for supervised, age-appropriate play and to encourage outdoor learning, physical activity and social development for the children of the Transitional Housing program. Granted in 2013.

The best part is that the park is literally our backyard – it gives us something to look forward to. The park is inspirational, which makes the entire program even that more awesome! ### LICKING COUNTY COALITION OF CARE

\$2,505 to support a one-year planning project for the expansion of emergency financial assistance services to Western Licking County. These services are available to anyone over 18 years of age. Granted in 2013.

### LICKING COUNTY EDUCATIONAL SERVICE CENTER

\$12,039 to support the "Equality in Technology" program by purchasing Smart Board technology to enhance the educational opportunities available to The Citadel's elementary students (grades K to 5). Granted in 2012.

### LICKING COUNTY FAMILY YMCA

\$48,212 to support the "All for One Camp" summer program for children with physical, social, and emotional disabilities that mirrors the themes and daily schedule of the traditional YMCA camp experience. This program has been created in conjunction with the Licking County Board of Developmental Disabilities. Granted in 2012 (\$23,750) & 2013 (\$24,462).

### LICKING COUNTY FIRE DEPARTMENTS

\$8,582 to provide smoke and carbon monoxide detectors for families with financial need through the 18 fire departments in Licking County. Granted in 2012 (\$6,059) & 2013 (\$2,523).

### LICKING COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT

\$22,369 to support the prevention of dental cavities in children by sealing the teeth of 2nd and 6th graders in 16 Licking County schools in the Lakewood, Newark and North Fork school districts. Granted in 2013.



### LICKING COUNTY HUMANE SOCIETY

\$10,000 to support the construction of a new, larger shelter of more than 6,600 sq. ft. on 4 acres in Heath doubling the capacity of the current facility, housing up to 40 dogs and 60 cats. Granted in 2013.

### LICKING COUNTY LIBRARY

\$995 to support an annual subscription for the Foundation Center's "Foundation Directory Online" which will provide area nonprofits and individuals access to nationwide grant and scholarship opportunities at the Licking County Library's downtown location. Granted in 2012.

\$530 to support a 3-day writing workshop during Cultural Diversity/ Right to Read Week exposing students to various cultures and backgrounds and help create diversity through literature at Licking Heights West Elementary School. Granted in 2013.

### LICKING/KNOX GOODWILL INDUSTRIES, INC.

\$5,000 to support the positive social mentoring activities of the Goodwill GoodGuides program to keep youth (who are at-risk for juvenile delinguency, teenage pregnancy and dropping out of school) engaged while school is not in session. Granted in 2013.

### LICKING MEMORIAL DENTAL CLINIC FOR CHILDREN

\$96,000 to support access to preventive dental care to the uninsured children of low-income families in Licking County. The clinic offers basic dental procedures such as exams, cleanings, fillings and tooth extractions to children who are under the age of 18 and are not covered by private dental insurance. Granted in 2012 (\$48,000) & 2013 (\$48,000).

### LICKING VALLEY LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

\$10,000 to support the "READY! For Kindergarten" program for addressing the issue of low literacy skills in preschool children and educating parents about the importance of helping their children develop literacy skills from birth forward and giving them the targets, tools and training to make it happen. Granted in 2012.

### LOOK UP MINISTRIES / LOOK UP DENTAL CLINIC

\$15,000 to support supplies, equipment, clinic overhead, and the salary of the Clinical Operations Provider in order to deliver urgent dental healthcare to adults in Licking County who are uninsured and/or indigent. There are no other dental clinics for adults in Licking County. Granted in 2013.
