

LCF and the United Way partner to host enrichment series

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NEWARK – The Licking County Foundation and the United Way of Licking County are partnering to host the 2015 Licking County Nonprofit Enrichment Series. The goal for this series is to provide high-quality, low-cost capacity-building programs which are located close to home, and cover the topics that local nonprofit leaders have identified as most important to their work.

Beginning February 2015, the series will kick-off with a 2-day standards for excellence clinic series to provide best practices on how the most well managed and responsibly governed organizations operate. Areas covered include: mission and program; governing body; conflict of interest; human resources; financial and legal; public accountability; fundraising; and public affairs and public policy.

Participating organizations must commit a team of two representatives to participate in both days of the series. Space is limited to 25 teams. Cost for participation is \$150 per organization and includes lunch.

Following the clinic series, eight capacity building seminars, scheduled March through November, will allow a deeper dive into topics that matter most to Licking County's nonprofits, including Board Development, HR, Fundraising, Marketing and PR, Outcomes and Measures, Financial and Legal, Leadership and Strategic Planning. Participants can register for individual seminars à la carte for \$15 per seminar or register to attend all eight seminars for the discounted rate of \$100. Space is limited to 50 individuals per seminar.
