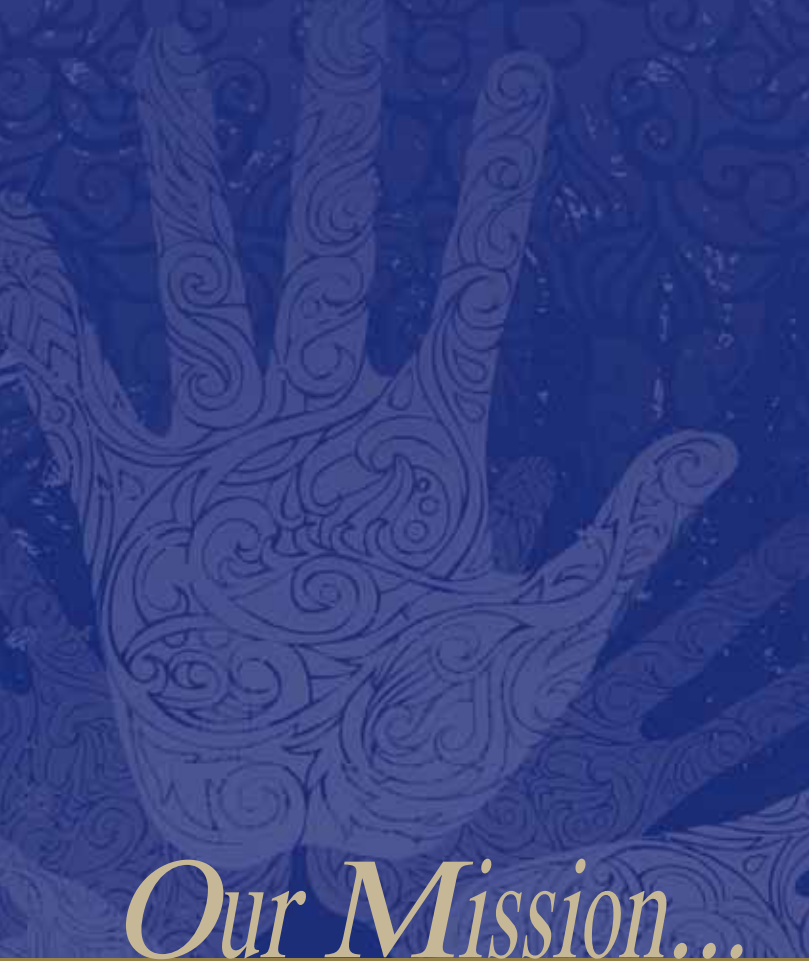

After more than 60 years, the Licking County Foundation has accumulated a wealth of fundraising knowledge. This year we began a series of Endowment Building Workshops to share our knowledge and our passion with other organizations helping to advance our community. We are excited to continue these workshops in 2010.



Each year we recognize one individual above all others for his or her extraordinary compassion and integrity. This year's Everett D. Reese Award honoree is Connie Baldwin. A former teacher at Cherry Valley Elementary School, Connie's philanthropic focus has always been education. She has supported local causes too numerous to mention, but her gifts to Central Ohio Technical College and The Ohio State University at Newark are nothing short of extraordinary.

From the Constance Corkwell Baldwin Academic Suite, to the Constance Corkwell Baldwin Fireside Lounge, Connie has built several wonderful spaces for individuals to gather and learn. 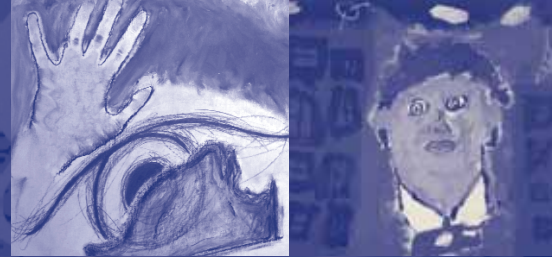

With the help of hundreds of caring donors, many dedicated nonprofit organizations, important causes and college-bound students were supported through grant awards from our charitable funds.

Competitive Community Grants

Awarded annually through unrestricted and field of interest funds, these discretionary grants help nonprofits meet the ever-changing needs of our community.

American Red Cross: \$5,000 to help replace an aging vehicle dedicated to the retrieval and transportation of life-saving blood products—more than 10,000 units of blood are collected annually in Licking County and have the potential of saving more than 30,000 lives.

Central Ohio Technical College: \$26,250 to help support CollegeASPIRE, an on-campus summer workshop experience for engaging at-risk 11 to 18 year-olds in learning, expanding skill sets, exposing potential career pathways, and breaking down perceived barriers to college.

Downtown Newark Association: \$4,000 to plant and maintain a four-season garden around the Courthouse Square's gazebo, serving as a focal point for visitors year-round.

Granville Studio of Visual Arts: \$7,513 to help fund the opening of a creative education center that provides Licking County students and teachers with on-site visual arts classes.

Licking County Aging Program: \$11,000 to help support the purchase of the Sam Scan Meal Delivery System, a scanning hardware and software system that streamlines and expands the organization's meal service for adding new clients and spending more time with them.

Licking County Center for the Visually Impaired: \$60,000 to provide eye examinations and eye-glasses for financially-disadvantaged children and adults (under 59) in Licking County.

Licking County Children & Families First Council/Pooled Funds Program: \$20,000 to assist low income children who are in need of specialized services such as mental health assessments, speech therapy, family therapy, medication dispensers and lock boxes.

Licking County Community Health Clinic: \$36,000 to help support the relocation of the Community Health Clinic for better serving its clients and fulfilling its mission of treating low income residents of Licking County.

Licking County Department of Job and Family Services, the Licking County Health Department, Newark City Schools, and the Licking County Educational Service Center: \$15,000 to assist low income children with emergency medical, dental and behavioral health treatments—since 1992, the Miller Fund Checkbook has met the healthcare needs of many children who are not eligible for health benefits under Healthy Start/Healthy Families.

Licking County Health Department/Head Lice Eradication Program: \$25,000 to help low income families deal with head lice effectively—decreasing the spread of head lice, keeping children in school, increasing children's self-esteem and enhancing parental self-sufficiency.

Licking Memorial Health Systems: \$75,000 to help support the opening of a dental care clinic that serves Licking County's uninsured, low-income children with preventative care and minor restorations—covering the costs of services, supplies and office space.

The Midland Theatre: \$20,000 to help support programs that bring young people and their families to the theatre for arts experiences—including opportunities for those in our community who could not afford this experience otherwise.

My Place To Be: \$10,000 to help support Camp MakeBelieve, a multi-media system that provides innovative, hands-on tools to assist children with Autism Spectrum Disorder master self-control.

Newark City Schools - Middle Schools (Heritage, Liberty and Wilson): \$3,000 to fund a presentation by R5 Productions that equips, empowers, and encourages students to rediscover hope in their lives and deal with the dangers of drugs, online blogging, and social profiling.

West Licking Historical Society: \$10,000 to dismantle and move the Fountain School to the Harrison Township Complex.

Giving Back

MAKING A DIFFERENCE We continue to be very grateful to our family of 206 funds which have a significant history of giving back and improving the lives of many in our community. Year after year, these funds strengthen almost every aspect of life including education, arts and culture, youth and families, health and human services, parks and recreation, and faith-based organizations.

Opportunities for Giving

Anyone can be a donor and make a difference. Supporting the organizations, causes or community needs that are most important to you is simple:

- Choose one or a combination of named funds to meet your charitable interests
- Build your fund in increments—the minimum balance for grants to begin varies with each fund type
- Contribute to almost any fund already in existence at the Foundation—at any time and in any amount

Types of Funds

We offer a variety of fund types to match donor interests. Funds can be restricted in purpose, geographic area or specific charitable organization—or may be unrestricted to meet the community's ever-changing needs. Most of our funds fall within these main categories:

- Unrestricted, Field of Interest, Agency, Designated Agency, Donor Advised, Community Charitable, Project and Scholarship

Under most circumstances, contributions that are made to start a fund or add to an existing fund are never spent. Only the growth or income a fund generates is available for making grants.

Ways to Give

We can administer a broad range of charitable investments. Donors can contribute a wide variety of assets to start a fund, such as:

- Gifts of cash or publicly traded securities; assignment of a life insurance policy; Charitable Remainder Trusts; Charitable Lead Trusts; bequests; transfer of private foundation assets; Charitable Gift Annuity; real estate; and gifts of tangible personal property

You are encouraged to work with your estate planning professional or tax advisor to determine the type of gift that is right for you and your family. Tax deductions are earned when your gift is made, while grants awarded from your fund will continue into the future.
