As you know, Connie Hawk has served the Foundation as President since 2007, and during her tenure, our endowment has grown, our organization has thrived, and our programming and funding have made invaluable contributions to Licking County and the region.

Thus, it is with mixed emotions that we announce to you Connie's plans to retire at the end of 2023. True to Connie's leadership style of doing the most important things in the most planful way, this

announcement gives us ample time to conduct a robust search for a highly qualified new President, while ensuring a smooth leadership transition for the Foundation.

Our board and leadership team have been deliberate about succession planning for some time and are well positioned for success. To assist us in this search, the Governing Committee has established an internal search committee and hired a consultant that specializes in coaching nonprofits through leadership succession and executive placement. The search committee is focused on identifying and recruiting a talented, experienced leader who recognizes the importance of philanthropy and the role it plays in enhancing the vitality and opportunity in Licking County. The right candidate will be both innovative and collaborative, and will share our vision for the role of the Licking County Foundation in ensuring a vibrant future for our community.

There are several important things you should know:

- Our foundation is strong, and our community impact has never been more critical, as the region is expanding rapidly and the need for philanthropy remains a priority.
- The Foundation continues to meet its fiduciary responsibilities and our funds and investments are secure and growing.

 During the search, our work to support our donors and to direct funds throughout Licking County where they are needed will remain on course.
- We are thrilled that Connie has agreed to remain with the Foundation in a consulting role to see the Sullivan Building adaptive reuse project, a cornerstone of the Foundation's recent work, through to completion.
- The position will be posted in early April, with interviews to follow. Final candidates will be presented to the full Governing Committee and a new President named by the end of this year. It is planned that Connie and the new President overlap in their leadership.

We are confident that this process will allow for a seamless leadership transition that benefits the community, our donors and the Foundation's future with no disruption to funding or services.

The line from the poet Wordsworth captures both the appreciation of what Connie has accomplished, and the hope our Governing Committee feels for the future. We take seriously the responsibility before us, and are excited for the opportunity to build on what Connie has done during her tenure. We are grateful that even as we consider new leaders, we are fortunate to have Connie's commitment to continued work on behalf of the Foundation and our community. We look forward to providing important updates to our donors and other partners along with us on this journey.
